

## Participants needed for a study at the University of Oxford!

Can you help? Researchers are looking for children aged 10-15 who have difficulties with language to take part in their study. The study is led by Dorothy Bishop and Kate Watkins at the University of Oxford.

### What do we want to know?

We are interested in understanding what makes your brain special. Different people's brains look and work differently, and we're running a study to find out how those differences relate to how we talk and understand what others say. We do this using MRI scanning, which is a safe method that lets us take detailed pictures of brains.



### Who are we looking for?

10-15 year olds who have grown up speaking English in the UK and have language problems that involve speaking or listening. Sometimes these children have a diagnosis of Dyslexia or Developmental Language Disorder (DLD).

### What is involved?

We ask children to complete some tests of language and some computer games (~2 hours) and have an MRI scan (~1 hour).

### Where does it take place?

The MRI scans take place at the Wellcome Centre for Integrative Neuroimaging (WIN) in Oxford. The behavioural testing can take place either at your home, school or in Oxford. If you choose to take part, we'll pay for you to travel to Oxford, and to stay overnight if you need to.

### Where can I find out more?

If you would like to know more about this study, please get in touch with us. We will ask some questions to make sure it is safe to have an MRI scan. We have lots of available slots on weekends and school holidays if you would like to take part.
